

Campton Lower School – Primary PE and Sport Premium Report for 2016/17

The Primary PE and Sport Premium was launched by the government in April 2013 and is said to be available to 2020. It is ring-fenced funding to be used by the School to improve quality and breadth of our PE, Sport and physical activity provision.

The national vision is for “All pupils leaving Primary School to be physically literate and with the knowledge, skills and motivation necessary to equip them for a healthy lifestyle and lifelong participation in physical activity and sport.”

In academic year 2016/17 we received: £8,470. It is calculated at 8,000, plus £5 per eligible pupil.
